## Lesser lights shine at Winter Games

hundreds of representatives from across Ontario in the Ontario Winter Games this week. It's their week to grab the atten-

Of the 19 sports to be played this week, Mississauga has representatives in 13. None of the athletes is ranked nationally a prerequisite to qualifying.

The athletes compete in Olympic style at Kingston, which has had a volunteer committee working for nine months in preparation for the Games. An additional incentive for athletes is the fact that 10 of the 19 sports are qualifying rounds for the Canada Winter Games at Brandon, Manitoba Feb. 12 to 24.

Streetsville Derbys could earn a berth in the Canada Games and revenge at the

same time. Derbys have lost the last two Ontario Junior B championship finals to the Stratford Cullitons. Derbys also lost to Stratford in the 1976 Winter Games, settling for a bronze medal.

Hockey is split into two divisions of three teams. Streetsville plays a round robin set against Marathon (located 200 kilometres northeast of Thunder Bay) and Thessalon (north of Sudbury) while Stratford is in the division with Bramalea Blues and Ottawa South Canadiens. The games will be broadcast live over CJMR radio Mississauga and CHWO radio Oakville. The first game is Thursday at 9 a.m. and Friday at 9 a.m.
