	14-2-41		No flying. Heavy overcast and rain.	
	15-2-41		Flying from 1300 hrs only due to low overcast and snow.	
	16-2-41		A memorial service was held in the Theatre, conducted by F/L Harston in remembrance of seven officers and airmen killed in flying accidents since Dec. 13th, 1940. Numerous relative and friends of the deceased attended. Flying all day. also night flying.	
	17-2-41		Visibility poor. Flying washed out.	
	18-2-41		Two hours solo flying in morning, then washed out due to heavy snow. Flying continued at 1330 hours.	
	19-2-41		S/L Falkenberg left for Brantford (No. 5 SFTS) to preside at a District Court Martial. Also F/L McCulloch, F/O Douglass, F/O Higgins and F/O Badgley as officers under instruction. Only four hours flying today. Snow and wind.	
	20-2-41		No flying until 11.30 hrs. Three hours of dual only carried out.
