Dear Dr. Tolmie:—

As stated in my letter to you of June 15 containing the account of the meeting called by Mrs. Stewart McClenaghan at her house on June 14, the task of informing the conservative women throughout Canada of the project of forming a federal association was left, by unanimous consent, in my hands. It was estimated that this work would be completed by the end of September, when it is purposed to call another meeting, at which I shall present my report. It is confidently hoped that those constituencies that now have flourishing Conservative Women's Associations will then be ready to form provincial organizations, and that the formation of a federal association will speedily follow.

Appreciating to the full the honor of this commission, I desire earnestly to fulfil its obligations, and for this purpose would respectfully request the hearty co-operation of your committee in the following:—

- (a) — That I obtain from your office as complete a list as possible of all Women's Conservative Associations of whatever character, at present existing in the Dominion of Canada.
- (b) — That through your office I may have typed or printed and mailed such circulars as shall be necessary (the matter of which shall be approved by you), and other relative correspondence; being also supplied with other office furnishings as needed.
- (c) — That in consideration of these services the sum of \$ 1000 (one thousand) be placed at my disposal, as it will be necessary to devote my undivided attention to this project.

With many thanks for your constant help and sympathetic interest in my ideas, and trusting that these suggestions may have your entire approval,
