I have to request you to arrange to continue during the coming season the survey of Indian Reserves in Treaty No. 8. This work was commenced by Mr. Ponton two seasons ago.

The work consists in completing the survey of the reserve situated on swan river, south of Lesser Slave Lake, and others that may be required in that neighbourhood; the survey of the reserve or reserves that may be required at or near Peace River Landing, and those that may be required quired at Sturgeon Lake.

This work you will please do in the sequence you may judge to be most expedient.

wherever possible you should tie your surveys to the Dominion Lands surveys, or to well known Geographical points.

You will please be careful to supply yourself with copies of all maps, plans and documents that you may require.

You should lay out the areas required as provided for in the Treaty. In every case you will require to ascertain the names of the Indians for whom each parcel of land is laid out, as well as their Treaty number, and the mamber of persons in their families.
