The present then left Pte Laplante with me and I then proceeded to have him medically examined by Dr. V.G. Alipert, M.I.R., Q.M.V.H. Following Dr. Allport's examination he had a routine Chest X-Ray, and a prescription was prescribed for him. This information was created on an MFB 292, which followed Pte Laplante to 25 00D. After Pte Laplante had been turned over to his escort, I telephoned Capt Le Claire, the M.O. at 25 COD, re his prescription and recommendations,

Lt.-Colonel G. H. Raymond, RCAMC (AF), Officer 1/o Surgery Montreal Military Hospital, had told me early in the afterneon of 5 Oct 49 that Pte Laplante had surrendered voluntarily to Abbe Chaisson late that morning and was being brought to the hospital for medical care.

After receiving Lt-Colonel Raymond's telephone call, I contacted WO I Haimbrook, RGAMC (AF), Superintending Clerk, CMO's Office, HQ Quebec Command, who arranged through the Provest Marshal's office for an escort to be dispatched to pick up Pte Laplante on his arrival at the hospital.
