A. 1145-1200 hours, sir.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Why the time?

A. No reason.

Q. Why on the Summary of Evidence did you say 2300-2345 hours and now you state 1145 and 12 o'clock?

Q. If you were out after 1200 o'clock midnight, you would be AWL?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. What time did you leave work?

A. Approximately 6.45 - 7.00 o'clock
