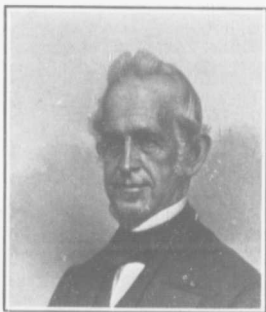

mason and carpenter work. The fact that building construction was much cheaper then than now is seen in that the contract for the mason work was \$10,712 and for the carpenter work \$4,500. The total cost of building, with ground, when first opened was about \$40,000. Later about \$17,000 was expended on the addition of the new Sunday School and Lecture Hall.

At the north end of the auditorium of the Church two Cenotaphs were placed by the Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church to perpetuate the memory of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Jackson, as founders of the Chair of Theology in Victoria College. These serve also to keep fresh in the memory
