

**MEDICINE HAT, N.W.T.**—John Galt, C.E., of Toronto, has submitted complete plans of proposed sewerage system and a public meeting will be held shortly to consider them.

**CHATHAM, ONT.**—J. L. Wilson & Son, architects, have prepared plans for a Presbyterian church at Delmer and for Methodist churches at Goderich, Leamington and Corinth.

**BERLIN, ONT.**—Among the buildings to be erected this year are a large addition to the factory of the Lang Tanning Co. and a one-storey warehouse for the Berlin Felt Boot Co.

**MONCTON, N.B.**—Dr. R. L. Botsford has purchased a site about three miles from this town and will have plans prepared at once for private sanitarium for treatment of consumptives.

**COLLINGWOOD, ONT.**—The Property Committee have been empowered to obtain information with the object of erecting a new Collegiate Institute and a public school in the West Ward.

**CLINTON, ONT.**—A by-law to grant a loan of \$6,000 to the Clinton Knitting

Co. will be submitted to the ratepayers May 1st. The company agree to erect a brick or cement factory 90 x 45 feet.

**TAVISTOCK, ONT.**—Mr. Schlermer intends building a residence on William street. R. Krag will build on Woodstock street.—George Faulhafer intends building a new house.

**WOODSTOCK, ONT.**—The Cyclone Wire Fence Co., of Toronto, have been given a free site in this city and will erect a factory.—The Ann Arbor Machine Co. have secured a site from the C. P. R. for a factory.

**MEAFORD, ONT.**—Thomas Kennedy, architect, Barrie, has been instructed to prepare plans for a combination agriculture, hockey and curling rink building, similar to those erected in Barrie by him.

**HALIFAX, N.S.**—A bill has been given its third reading in the Provincial Legislature granting a subsidy of \$5,000 a mile to the Cape Breton Railway Co. for construction of railway from St. Peter to Louisburg.

**LAKEFIELD, ONT.**—A by-law will

be voted on this week guaranteeing \$15,000 worth of bonds of the Lakefield Furniture & Manufacturing Co. The company agree to erect a building and install machinery costing \$15,000.

**FORT WILLIAM, ONT.**—J. F. McGregor, of Brandon, and A. E. Hitchcock, of London, England, have purchased a portion of the J. G. King property on corner of Victoria ave. and May street and will likely build thereon.

**FREDERICTON, N.B.**—George D. Bayles, president of the Bayles Pulp & Paper Co., Binghamton, N.Y., has secured an option on the William Richards Company's timber lands, and if acquired will build large pulp and paper mills.

**REGINA, N.W.T.**—Mayor Laird will erect a \$7,000 residence this summer.—Excavation work commenced last week on the new Knox church.—On April 27th the ratepayers will vote on a by-law to raise \$160,000 to complete the waterworks system.

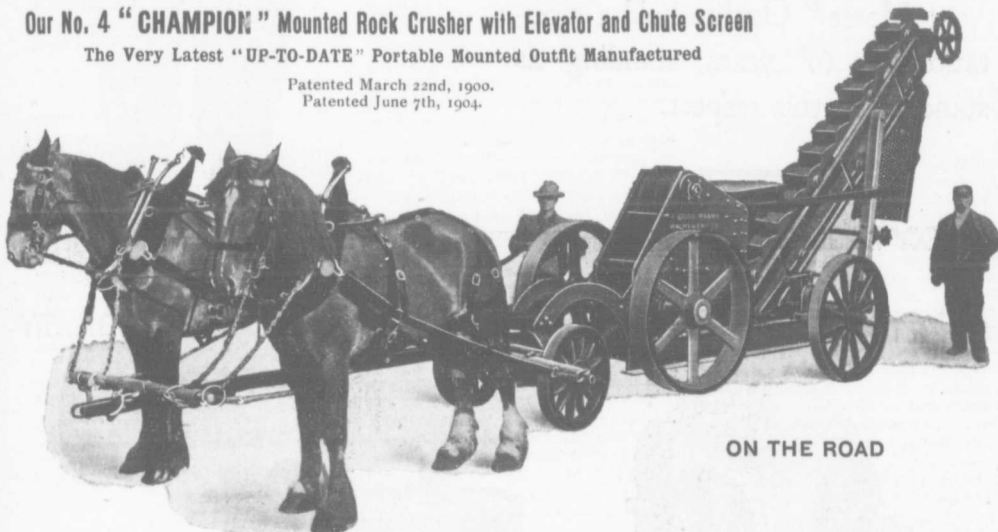
**RIDING MOUNTAIN, MAN.**—F. A. Stark and Harry Swain will each build a residence.

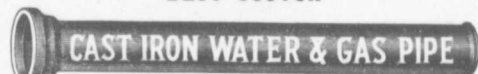
