Mr. Kuhn, says the Bourdeaux Journal of Medicine, found that vaccination performed on infants, the second, third, or fourth day after a previous vaccination, always succeeded. When performed on the fifth day it took in one half the cases. If attempted on the seventh, eighth, ninth, or tenth day, it failed. Hence, according to these experiments, vaccinia does not begin to be protective until after four days from the inoculation, and as variola has an incubation of three or four days, it may happen that a person exposed to it the fourth day after vaccination may be seized with small-pox at the moment when the vaccine vesicle is at its highest point of development. It is not until the ninth day after vaccination, therefore, that one can be considered secure from small-pex.
