The importer claiming drawback under the above quoted Act shall, in order to entitle himself thereto deliver to the Collector of Customs at the Port where entry was made and duty paid on such drawn tubes or piping, a declaration in the form No. 1 tollowing: which said declaration shall be subscribed to under oath.

In case the importer is not at the same time the manufa turer of the boilers and cannot therefore from personal knowledge affirm as to the actual use made of such drawn tubes or piping, he shall in place of the form No. 1 make use of the form No. 2, and the manufacturer of the boilers in the construction of which such duty paid drawn tubes or piping was actually ma e use of, shall attach to said declaration No. 2 and subscribe and make oath to a declaration in the form No. 3 hereto ap-

The Collector of Customs at the Port where such try was made shall thereupon examine the entry and the invoice of such drawn tubes or piping, and shall certify in the form of No. 4, whether the declaration so produced covers the whole part of su h entered drawn tubes or piping, and whether it corresponds with the value as per invoice and with the amount of duty paid as per said entry.
