CHAP. 27.

An Act to make Temporary Provision for the Election of Members to serve in the House of Commons.

[Assented to 23rd May. 1873.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to make temporary provision for Promble. the election of Members to serve in the House of Commons of Canada: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

- 1. This Act shall be in force during one year from the time of Duration of the passing thereof, and from thence until the end of the then next Act. session of Parliament, and no longer.
- 2. The laws in force in the several Provinces of Canada, Nova Election laws Scotia, and New Brunswick at the time of the Union, on the first in force in the day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven relative, Provinces at to the following matters, that is to say, the qualifications and distible Union to qualification of persons to be elected or to sit or vote as Members to certain of the Legislative Assembly or House of Assembly in the said exceptions. several Provinces respectively, the voters at elections of such members, the oaths to be taken by voters, the powers and duties of Returning Officers, and generally the proceedings at and incident to such elections, shall, as provided by "The British North America Act, 1867," continue to apply respectively to elections of Members to serve in the House of Commons for the Provinces of Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, subject to the exceptions and provisions hereinafter made.
- 3. The polling at any election of a Member to serve in the Polling to House of Commons, for any Electoral District in either of the continue one Provinces of Quebec or Ontario, shall continue for one day only; Ontario and and the poll shall be opened at nine o'clock in the morning and Quebec. closed at five o'clock in the afternoon of such day.
- 4. In the Province of Ontario, subject to the special provisions Qualification hereinafter made, the qualification of voters at elections for Memors of voters no bers of the House of Commons shall be that established by the laws in force in that Province on the twenty-third day of January one thousand eight and sixty-nine, as the qualification of voters at elections of Members of the Legislative Assembly; and the voters' Voters lists. lists to be used at elections of Members of the House of Commons shall be the same as if such elections were of Members of the Legislative Assembly on the basis of the qualification aforesaid; and the polling sub-divisions or wards shall be the same as if such elections. Returning Officer shall provide a polling place for each sub-division Polling places.
