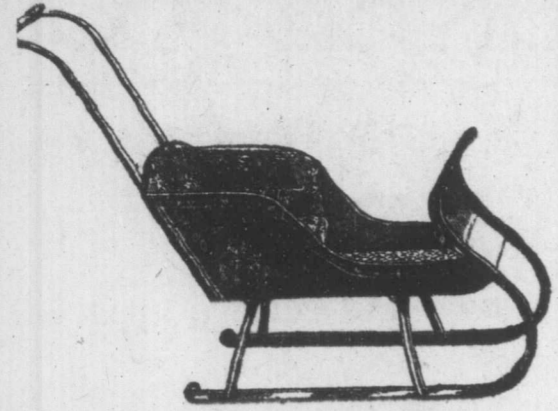
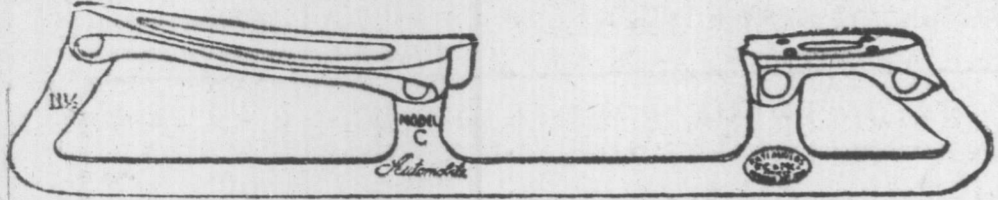

## PATRIOTIC CONCERT HELD AT GRAND FALLS

**Splendid Programme Rendered to a Packed Hall—Goodly Sum Raised for Belgian Relief Fund**

A concert was produced in the Town Hall, at Grand Falls, on Thursday, December 3rd and was repeated on Friday, Dec. 11th that for the scope of its programme and the excellence of its execution has not been equalled in the history of this progressive inland town.

The items as listed below are sufficient evidence of the high musical standard that was set. The programme was based on the concert recently held in St. John's, and in its main points was practically identical. The community here are certainly greatly indebted to the kindness of many in St. John's in lending costumes, etc., which helped in a great measure towards an unprecedented and highly gratifying result.

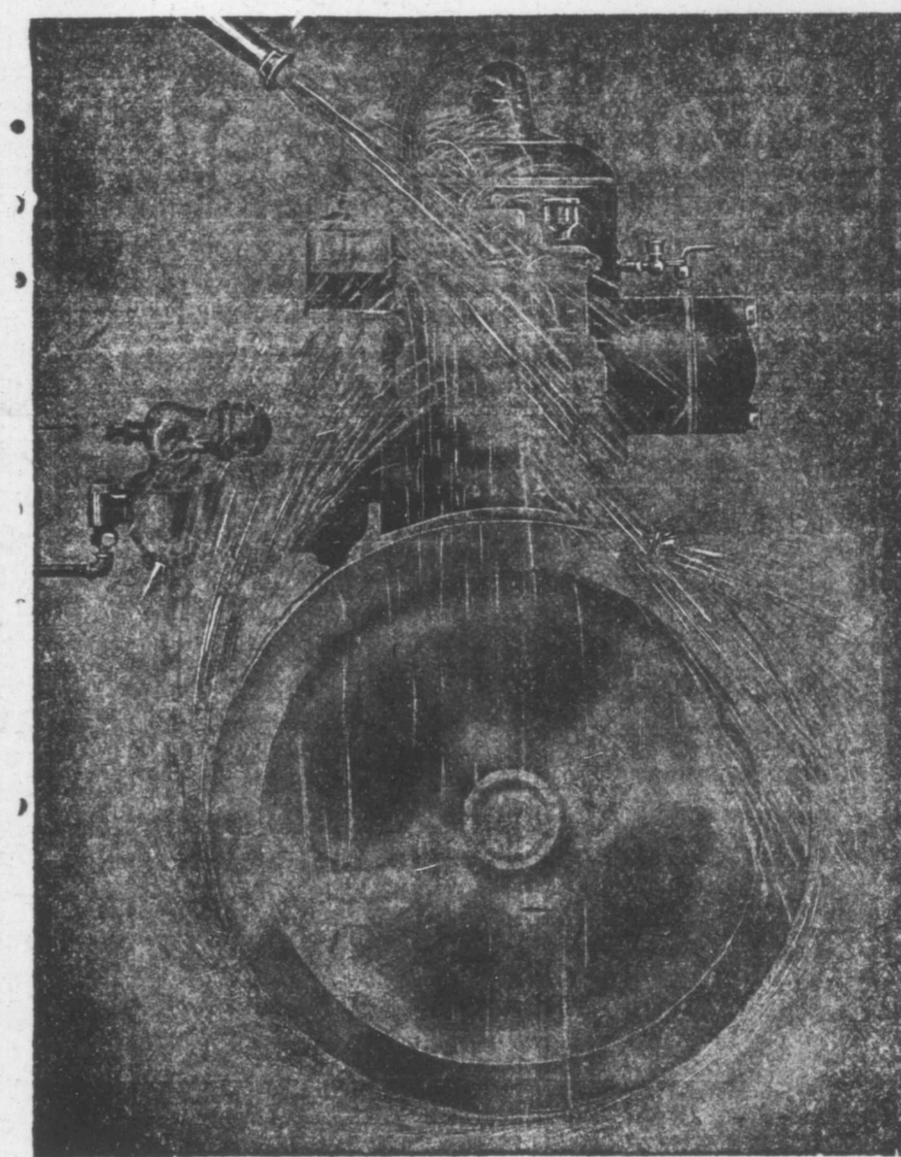
