SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

Under section 63 of the Dominion Lands Act, any settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchase home in certain districts. Price \$800 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 20 acres and erect a house worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to re-union in case of rough scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
