OTTAWA, Aug 29.—Mr. FG Jonah, C E,
who has been engaged in surveying the
Straits of Northumberland on behalf
of the Dominion Government, has
completed his labors. The object of the
survey was to ascertain the practicability
of the subway to connect Prince Edward
laland with the mainland. The route
surveyed this year is from Money Point,
Cape Jouriman, on the New Brunswick
side, to Carleton Point, Prince Edward
Island, a distance of 61 naurical or about
71 statute miles, being rather more than
a mile shorter than the line previously
surveyed between Capes Tormentine and
Traverse, Mr. Jonah states that there
are no engineering difficulties in the way
of the proposed subway. The bottom is
devoid of sadden depression, there are
very few rocks, and the underlaying clay
is very firm. It is proposed to construct
piers on each side of the strait, that on
the New Brunswick side extending a
mile and a quarter from the shore and
that on the Island side a quarter of a
mile thus leaving to be covered by the
subway only about five nautical or nearly six statute miles. The report of the
