CIVIL SERVICE EXAMS OCT. 26
Competitive civil service examinations for several classes will be held at various points throughout Canada from October 26 to October 30 including Sherbrooke, in Quebec; Fredericton, Chatham, St. John and Moncton, in New Brunswick; Kentville, Yarmouth, Halifax and Sydney, in Nova Scotia, and Charlottetown and Summerside in Prince Edward Island.

THE BEAVERBROOK SCHOLARSHIP
Although September 1 was set as the date for receiving applications for the Lord Beaverbrook scholarship to be awarded New Brunswick high school graduates, it is expected that the governors of the trust will give consideration to any additional applications which may be received up to the time of their meeting. A number of St. John and other students have made applications and it is hoped that announcement of the awards can be made within a few days.

NEW INSPECTOR FOR ST. JOHN
Charles Houghton, formerly desk sergeant on the St. John police force, and lately a detective with the investigating department of C. P. R. in the New Brunswick district, has been appointed district chief inspector under the Prohibition Act for the St. John district. The appointment was confirmed by the provincial government upon the recommendation of Rev. W. D. Wilson, chief inspector, and it is understood it will be followed by the appointment of a complete new staff of inspectors for the St. John district. The city police force in Fredericton has been entrusted with the duty of looking after the enforcement of the Prohibition Law there. Chief Finley will be the supervisor in charge.

5 1/2% DISCOUNT

NEW ELECTION ACT PROCEDURE
