HALIFAX, N.S., Jan. 11. A railway accident occurred near Boston yesterday. Nine persons were killed and twenty-two wounded, several fatally.

French Chambers assembled yesterday. Floquet has been elected President of the Deputies.

The St. John authorities have found eight indictments against the second mate and boatswain of the ship Vancouver for monstrous inhuman crimes against sailors. Twenty christian churches have been burned

and converts massacred by the populace at Fukien, China.

News reaches Cairo that Stanley met Emin Bey on December 22nd.

Another plot against the Czar has been discovered, and numerous arrests, including officers of the army, have been made. The conspiracy is centred at St. Petersburg. Court balls have been abandoned, and the Czar's stay at St. Petersburg will be shortened.
