ALBANY, To-day. John Mitchell, former President of the United Mine Workers, of America, decided to accept an appointment on the State Labor Commission. Three thousand machinists go on strike on Monday if a wage demand is not granted.

WHARTON, N. J., To-day. Two hundred and fifty armed deputy sheriffs, under the command of the private detective agency of Newark are guarding Hope Mine of the Empire Iron Co. The rioters wrecked the roadbed of the little railroad leading there to Progress for several weeks. Daylight brought cessation of outbreaks of riots which prevailed since sunset.

LONDON, To-day. Mrs. Charles Despard in a speech last night defined the policy of the Women's Freedom League as favoring law breaking without violence. She said women of the League refused to pay taxes, held meetings when forbidden by the police and in various ways manifested contempt for men-made law, but they differed from Militant Suffragettes by scrupulously refraining from damaging property and committing personal assault. The League was recently refused the use of its usual meeting hall because of incendiary speeches made in it by leaders. Dr. Anna Shaw, New York, addressing the Suffragettes' meeting at Westminster, said the conduct of the women in England had satisfied the people in the States that women with ballot would be unsafe, consequently American women were being voted down. The men of America, Dr. Shaw declared, were using the agitation of English women as a club over American women, trying to make them believe that women had shown themselves to be irresponsible and untrustworthy, but that was merely a cowardly excuse for cowardly men to cover their own cowardice and inconsistency. The women now had fifty-seven electoral votes in the States. Dr. Shaw said Roosevelt had taken up the question because he knew those votes would decide the next Presidential election.

Bankers in Collision.

The Burin schooner Marian May, Capt. Inkman, Jr., arrived in port on Friday morning with her bowsprit carried away. Capt. Inkman on being interviewed stated that shortly before daylight Tuesday morning, the schooner Nini Swin, another banker of Burin, ran into the Marian May and carried away the latter's bowsprit. He doesn't think the other vessel sustained any damage as she kept right on. A new bowsprit was made and put into place and the Marian May sailed again Monday morning. At the time of the collision the Marian May was codfishing in the Gulf, about a hundred miles off Bay of Islands, and had on board about two hundred qts.; she had previously landed five hundred qts.—Western Star, May 14.

Jury Disagreed.

Yesterday afternoon the case of the King vs. Goodland and Shallow for housebreaking and stealing a quantity of whiskey from the store of Ellis & Co., was continued. Mr. W. J. Higgins, counsel for the defendants, addressed the jury and spoke for an hour and twenty minutes. Mr. Warren, K. C., for the Crown, made a brief address to the jury. Justice Johnson then made his charge and intimated that during his term of ten years on the bench the present case was the clearest that ever came before him. The prisoners were refused bail.

The Mayor had similar views and contended that the Reid Company should carry out the contract they are getting paid for. Councillors Martin and Ryan thought similarly and criticized the Reid Company. The latter Councillor suggested that a reduction in the price of the contract be made. The oil question was then introduced. The Council will shortly experiment on the use of oil on our streets. The oil sprinkling service gives perfect satisfaction in special cases. Freshwater Road was flooded while at other thoroughfares the dust was blinding. The Reid Co.'s car did not go over the belt line once and gave an excuse that the weight of the car would spread the rails. If the company could not use their car they should have sent out a substitute Councillor Mully thought.
