## Citizens' Committee

### CONSIDER A PROPOSED SCHEDULE

Vice-Chairman Mr. W. A. O'D. Kelly presided at last night's meeting of the Citizens' Committee when some very important business in connection with the new Municipal Bill came up for discussion. Section 237, embracing five other sections, which has been under consideration for the past two weeks, was further discussed. One of the Committee men submitted a proposed schedule as a substitute to sections 211, 217 and 225, under the heading of "Taxes and Sources of Income," whereby the residences having different rentals should be taxed at different rates, those at from \$50 to \$100 at 5 per cent, to which shall be added 2½ per cent. for sewerage; for every \$50 increase in rental value there shall be a slight increase in percentage up to \$800, when 12 per cent. will be the fixed amount and for all rentals over that figure, to which shall be added in all cases 2½ per cent. for sewerage. It was further suggested that the land be taxed separately from the building. After much discussion it was decided that a sub-committee be formed, consisting of Messrs. Bartar, Lindsay and Joyce, together with the executive officers, Messrs. Soper, Kelly and Devine. Sections 238 to 241 inclusive, relative to routine matters in connection with the rules and regulations regarding the collectors of taxes, was passed after considerable discussion.

The meeting adjourned at 10.30 until 8 o'clock next Thursday night, when the sub-committee appointed will report.
