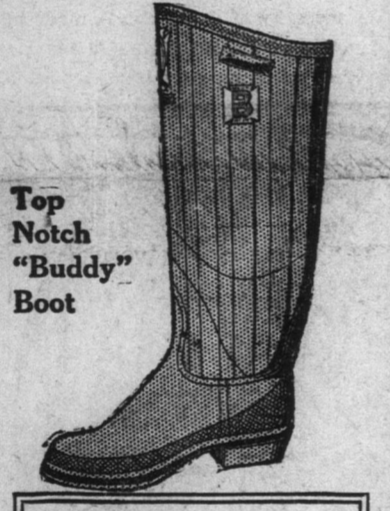

## PUBLIC NOTICE!

The Minister of Munitions in the United Kingdom has directed that certain materials (such as steel, tin plate, copper wire, etc., etc.), for which there is a demand for war purposes, cannot be supplied, either for home use or for exportation, without the production of a certificate from him. In order to facilitate the granting of such certificate, the Government have, on the nomination of the Board of Trade of Newfoundland, appointed a Committee, consisting of Hon. M. G. Winter, Messrs. W. S. Monroe and George R. Williams, to whom all persons desiring to send forward orders for the materials in question, must, in the first instance, make application. The Committee will take such application into consideration and, if they find that the materials desired are absolutely necessary, will endorse upon the application their approval of the same. The person ordering the goods will then send forward the endorsed application to the intending supplier of the material in the United Kingdom, and the supplier will present these papers and apply for the necessary certificate to the Minister of Munitions, with whom the decision will rest. No order for any such materials will be acted upon unless accompanied by the approval of the local Committee.
