Under the provisions of Chapter 46, Consolidated Statutes of Newfoundland (Second Series), His Excellency the Administrator in Council has been pleased to order that, from this date, and until further notice, all churches, schools, moving picture and other theatres, music, concert, dance and meeting halls, clubs and lodges within the City of St. John's shall be closed, and no meetings shall be held in any place of twelve or more persons.

2. Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable, on summary conviction before a Stipendiary Magistrate, to a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars and in default imprisonment not exceeding thirty days.
