

Shortage Balloons to Conserve Gasoline

"Breathing losses" of 50,000,000 gallons of gasoline yearly will be checked by the use of balloons to store vapor, it was reported to the American Chemical Society at its recent meeting in Los Angeles. This method was described in a paper prepared by Messrs. Wilson, Atwell, Brown and Chenicek, chemists of the Standard Oil Company of Indiana, who asserted that it is the first to prove economically effective in preventing evaporation losses from gasoline stored during winter and spring in anticipation of the tremendous summer demand.
