Notice is hereby given that application will be made by the Corporation of the City of London and County of Middlesex to the Legislature of Ontario, at its present session, for an act to provide for the incorporation and management of a Sanatorium for Consumptives, proposed to be erected and maintained by the applicant, and to be situated on the property of the Corporation, near the City of London, to be erected and maintained by a board of trustees, who shall be a body politic and corporate, and shall be composed of five or more members to be appointed by the council of the Corporation, with power to permit the appointment of an additional trustee or trustees, in a case or cases where a grant is to be made or benefits conferred upon the board by any person or body corporate, for such time as the board may see fit, and with power for the board to receive and disburse money, interest, at a rate to be agreed upon between them and any person making a gift to the board, during the lifetime of the donor, or for such term as may be specified in the deed or instrument by which the gift is made, and to enable the board to acquire and hold land, and to erect and maintain buildings, and to do all such things as may be necessary for the purposes aforesaid.

New York, March 2.—Theodore Higges, an employee of the Wayne Powder Works at Lincoln Park, N. J., saved his two sons from drowning yesterday in the Pompton River, although when preparing to rescue them he did not know who they were.

Theodore, Jun., 16 years old, and William, 12 years old, fell from the Morris Canal aqueduct into the river. The elder boy went to his brother's assistance and reached him just as the father of the boys reached the bridge over the bridge, which is low, and holding to the tongue, called to the boys to float down to the wagon. The boys did as they were told, and a minute later they were safe.
