

BELFAST RALLY AGAINST BILL

To Hold Great Demonstration When Home Rule Measure Is Introduced.

LAW HEAD OF AFFAIR

One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Persons To Take Part in the Procession.

London, April 8.—Belfast is to have another great anti-home rule demon-stration on Easter Tuesday, two days before the date set for the introduction of the home rule bill by the House of Commons. This time there will be no necessity of moving troops into the city, as was the case when Winston Spencer Churchill, first lord of the admiralty, held his now historic meeting in the chief town of Ulster. An Irish member, to make sure that Belfast would not again be put under practicall what amounted to martial law, to enable a prominent politician to speak, asked the question in the House of Commons the other day. The reply of Augustine Birrell, the Irish secretary, was that he thought the Nationalists could be depended upon

not to interfere with free speech. The head and centre of the demonstration is Andrew Bonar Law, the neader of the Unionist party. While he

London, April 8.—The decis-ion of the Miner's Federation this afternoon to order the men to resume work has brought intense relief to the whole country.
