The debts of the council of 1912 have been paid and the municipality's credit is giltedge. The city has \$3,500,000 worth of unsold debentures on hand. 

In discussing foods, Dr. Hill classifled them as follows: proteins, carbohydrates, fats, salts and water. Some time was also given to the explanation of the manner of assimilating foods. The body is composed of cells which are fed from the blood pumped from the heart. The nutriment in the blood the speaker aptly referred to as "keys' which fit different "locks," in the multitudinous cells. In this way certain food parts have an affinity for certain cells, and in this manner the different foods are taken to build up the

human body. Discussing adulterations, the speak er stated that there are several varieties prevalent. There is the mixing of foods with things of lesser qual ities, substitution, coloring and polsons. Adulterated foods also included decomposition of matter.

I believe in allowing manufacturers to make and sell whatever they like, providing they honestly label the ingredients used. Then people are aware what they are buying." The methods of combating harmful

adulteration are rigid inspection, advertising the adulterated foods, and in extreme cases, prosecution. Next Thursday evening a second lecture will follow on "Food and Drugs."
