

FOUR APPOINTMENTS MADE AT VICTORIA

Four appointments have been made to the staff of Victoria Hospital by the hospital trust, the additional members being Canadian in every case. Miss Agnes H. Greene, R.N., of St. Catharines has been appointed head nurse of the general operating room, and Miss Olive A. Mackay, R.N.C., registered nurse, Quebec, of Upper Melbourne, Que., has been appointed assistant superintendent of nurses.

Miss Ethel Robertson, R.N., of Brockville will act as training school office assistant, and Miss R. Taylor, R.N., of this city has been named as head nurse

of the medical service. These appointments are effective at once.

ASSESSMENT DEPT. WINS VICTORY OVER POLICE SERGEANT

William McCullough Has Property Value Boosted by Court of Revision.

The city assessment department lined up against the police at a session of the court of revision last night, when Sergeant William McCullough appealed the assessment of his property in ward two, declaring it to be excessive. The assessment department won out. The court after deep consideration decided to observe the law to the letter carefully when its stalwart guardians are involved, and consequently ruled that the error if any was in the other direction, and accordingly boosted the sergeant's property assessment \$2,000. He must now pay taxes on \$2,800.

Income and assessment tax appeals from property owners of ward two to an approximate number of 150 were heard at the session of the court of revision on Friday night.

Appearing for the Trans-Canada Theatres Company, John R. Minnick claimed that the assessed value of the Grand Opera House, \$97,000, is excessive. He explained that he was willing to sell the theatre immediately for \$20,000 less than the present assessed value. His appeal was left over for further consideration.

C. H. Ivey appeared in the interests of the London Institute of Musical Art, stating that the said corporation had purchased the property known as the Wortman estate to be used in a similar manner as the institute proper, which was exempted from taxation a year ago. Exemption for this addition was allowed.

R. H. Dowler appeared for Dowler & Co., claiming over-valuation, and stated that the property was not worth the assessed amount of \$95,000. He advised that the cellar of the building was unfit for use, by reason of sewage difficulties. This claim was also left in abeyance.

Messrs. Jared Vining, T. J. Murphy, Sheriff Cameron were in attendance at last night's session, with J. G. Richter and Stephen Grant acting in advisory capacities. The court was lengthy, commencing at 7:30 p.m. and lasting until near midnight.

SCHOOL ACCOMMODATION FOR EALING PROBABLE

No. 1 committee of the board of education, meeting Friday afternoon, passed a resolution asking No. 2 committee to take immediate steps to provide school accommodation for the district between Ealing and Chesley Avenue Schools. It is probable that a four-room, one-story school of stucco construction will be erected, on plans allowing for additions to it later.

Approval of the acceptance of county pupils in the city schools at the cost of instruction, \$4.81 per month, was voted. Leave of absence was recommended to several teachers, and a number of applications for positions on the teaching staffs of the city were referred to Inspector Edwards for future reference.

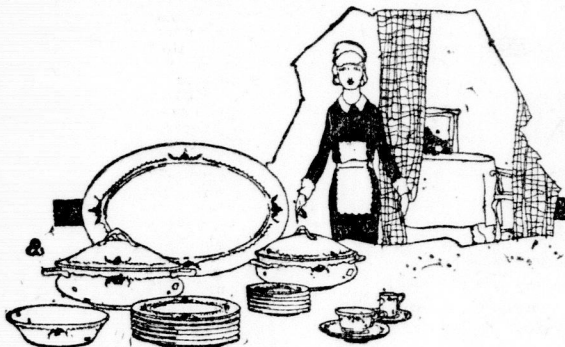

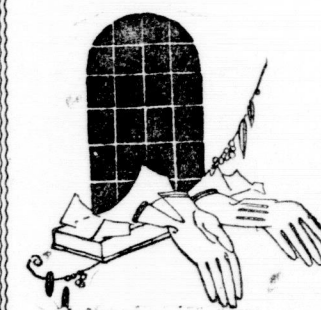
