Orients Win First 4-1 From Much-Touted Cordage Nine

Hodgson's Two-Bagger With Bases Filled in Third Turns Trick.

Brantford, Aug. 27.—Playing million dollar ball, the Orient infield backed up Russell's left hand slants and all but whitewashed the Cordage team in the first game of the O. B. A. intermediate series here today. Barrows handled 19 of the 27 putouts at first base and the rest were not at all out of the way. Barrows, Maylott and Oliver got everything that came their way and got the old pill over to first without loss of time. Russell only struck out one, but allowed only four hits. An error by Quick helped with the only run scored by the twine twisters, the pitcher-felder dropping an easy one.

Quick got the first hit of the game in the third, and stole second. Barrows walked Russell, hit for him, and then on a wide throw to third went right home. Burgess fanned. Maylott followed suit. Kilgus got four balls. Hodgson, in the clean-up position, with the bases filled, hit to right and the bags were cleared when the throw home bounced over Baird's head.

Smith was erratic and walked five more than usual for a time. Russell walked as many as he struck out.
