CALL OFF JUNIOR O.H.A. GAME Galt Finishes With Woodstock Tuesday Well On Milton

Water-Covered Ice Responsible and Manufacturers' League Will Be Compelled to Wait Until Thursday to Start Instead of To-Night

Springlike weather for the past week has made it impossible to start open ice hockey games in the O. H. A. junior series with Woodstock to-morrow night and to-night in the Manufacturers' League.

The ice surface at the Jubilee Rink resembles a lake, while the board floor at the Westminster Rink, where the Manufacturers' League stage their games, is exposed in many places.

Postponing the junior O. H. A. game to Thursday is a godsend for the players, as it is they will be compelled to play their first game at Tillsonburg on Friday night with little of any work-out, unless cold weather sets in immediately.

The first game of the season will probably be played on Friday, when the intermediates tackle St. Thomas here. The Manufacturers' League will get going on Thursday, according to present arrangements.

WAITING FOR ICE.

All is in readiness for the big Intermediate O. H. A. series opening game with St. Thomas at the Jubilee Rink on Friday night. All preliminary arrangements have been completed, excepting assurance for the weather man that there will be ice.

KENNEDY ADMITS CANADIANS TOO SLOW

OTTAWA, Jan. 3.—The Ottawa Journal, speaking of to-night's hockey match, says in part: "Canadians, of Montreal, face the angered Ottawa tonight in a forerunner to get back into the hunt for the first half honors. Ottawa will likely line up with Boucher on the defense replacing Cleghorn, and will go into action with Jack McKell as first in substitute. The loss of Cleghorn, of course, atrenged Ottawa's defense, but it is recalled that he was missing from the line-up when the game was clinched by the first half championship last year and George Boucher showed himself an utterly capable defense man.

Canadians may have some new faces to show in place of the veteran team, but they have been performing up to date. Kennedy is reluctantly compelled to admit that Pitts and others have played too long, and are tiring to Madison, to jump. Even Corbeau and Lalonde are showing signs of wear. Canadians have practiced four times within the past four days in an effort to achieve conditions, and they will throw all they have into the game. Ottawa are just as determined to show the Kennedy clan that in spite of the efforts to break up their combination they are going to win out."
