Torbrook Iron Mines.

On Thursday last a committee of the Municipal Council, consisting of Warden J. R. Roper, Councilors Mitchell and Elliott, who were appointed at the last session of the council to arrange the terms for the payment of the right of way for the Torbrook Railway, accompanied by a large number of prominent persons, paid a visit to the extensive mine situated now being carried on at Torbrook.

Amongst those present were: T. D. Ruggles, Q. C., His Hon. Judge Johnston, of Dartmouth, Councilors Pickett and Vidino, Honorable George Williams, J. R. Mills, M. P., Sheriff Moore, John Ervin, Esq., solicitor for the company, Mr. E. Gillis, Esq., Major Jacques and others.

The party were met at the Torbrook station by the President of the Torbrook Iron Company, R. S. Locke, Esq., and his son, the general manager. Here a special car and engine was provided to take the party to the mine, about four miles from Torbrook station. Ample opportunity was given for inspection of the road-bed, which was shown to be in excellent condition and equal to the main line, a very large cutting and a substantial bridge being part of the work performed. On arriving at the mine, about an hour was spent in visiting and inspecting the extensive workings, and the surface, consisting of engines, pumping and hoisting machinery, etc. Of course no inspection of the underground workings was possible, but this was explained to be very extensive and in some parts could be understood by the fine large shaft continually bringing ore to the surface.
