QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

CUTTING FODDER AND GRINDING GRAIN FOR FEEDING.

W. K. Foreman, Port Carling, Ont., wishes to know the saving there is in cutting grain and grinding fodder for stock:

It is very difficult to give definite information on these points owing to the great variety of conditions existing as to both grain and animals. As a rule experiments conducted along this line show increased gains from grinding grain, but in many cases the gains are not sufficient to pay the cost of grinding. Prof. Henry in his work on "Feeds and Feedings" has this to say in regard to grinding grains: "For horses which are out of the stable during the day and working hard, all grain, with the possible exception of oats, should be ground. For those at extremely hard work, all grain should be ground

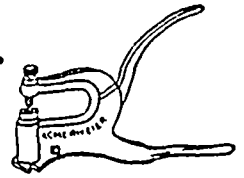

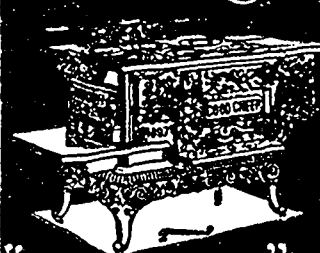
