## Friday, 2nd September.

During the night rain fell heavily, but it had ceased long before the time for shooting to commence on Friday, and there was almost perfect weather for the great match of the week, the contest of the sixty highest in the grand aggregate for

and for places upon the Wimbledon team of 1888. There was no sun, but the light was beautifully clear. Not a trace remained of the smoke which had been so troublesome the two preceding mornings, the rain having quenched the forest fires. There was scarcely any wind-none to give trouble with the Martini. All the sixty had made their entries in good time, and promptly at nine o'clock the match commenced. Everything was favorable to high scoring, and this was the order of the day. The splendid prizes offered caused every competitor to do his utmost. Sergt. Keddy, of the 68th, made a great bid for first place by putting 34 points out of 35 possible, to his credit at 200 yards; but he started with two outers at 500 yards, and thus spoiled his chances. At the end of the firing at the second range, Pte. Armstrong, of the Guards, was top man with 63 to his credit, and he seemed once more safely on the way to the big prize which he so narrowly missed last year, when he finished second. Capt. Mc-Micking, who had made 31 at 200 yards, had a damper put upon his hopes by the waving of a ricochet bar when his target reappeared after having gone down in response to his first shot at 500 yards. Six shots then fired as he thought the first had been, gave him 29 points, five bulls and inner, but the "ricochet" had ruined him. There were a number of men with scores over sixty when the 600 yards range was commenced, and the excitement began to run high amongst the spectators. Armstrong made three misses, and the vision of the prize money disappeared. Lieut. H. C. Chamberlin, the game little crack shot of the 43rd, starting with two magpies next made five bulls, making 31 at 600 yards, and 91 in the match, and was heartily congratulated upon making a prize score. But Lieut. Mitchell, firing alongside, had 88 with a shot to go and putting an inner to his credit took the lead with 92. Everybody congratulated him, he was the winner sure! But while the handshaking was still going on there was a great cheer from the butts on the left. Inquiry showed that Pte. Duncan, of the Queen's Own, who had made an even 30 at each of the former ranges, had topped his score with 33, and wound up with the grand total of 93, assuredly first place, for he was about the last to conclude. No others touched the nineties, and Duncan, Mitchell and Chamberlin, in that order, took the three handsome money prizes generously donated by His Excellency. This is the fourth occasion upon which Lieut. Mitchell has shared in these prizes. In 1880 and in 1881 he was third, and in 1883 he won first money. Lieut.
