PRAYERS.

Mr. Fleming (Eglinton), a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, delivered a Message from His Excellency the Governor-General, which was read by Mr. Speaker, as follows:

GEORGE P. VANIER

The Governor-General transmits to the House of Commons Estimates of sums required for the service of Canada for the year ending on the 31st March, 1963, and, in accordance with the provisions of the British North America Act, 1867, the Governor-General recommends these Estimates to the House of Commons.

On motion of Mr. Fleming (Eglinton), seconded by Mr. Churchill, the said Message and Estimates were referred to the Committee of Supply.

Mr. Balcer, seconded by Mr. Hees, moved,—That the House do go into Committee of the Whole at its next sitting to consider the following proposed resolution which has been recommended to the House by His Excellency:—

That it is expedient to introduce a measure to authorize and to provide for the construction and operation on behalf of Her Majesty of a line of railway in the Province of Quebec, between Matane and Ste-Anne des Monts, a distance of approximately 57 miles; to provide also that the Governor in Council shall pay to the Canadian National Railway Company an amount equal to the cost to the said Company of constructing the railway line (including the cost of survey of location and the cost of acquisition of the land required for the railway line) not exceeding in any case the sum of \$16,100,000.
