1. As a first step, Canada will publish in the Canada Gazette, Part I, a proposed regulation to reduce annual production and consumption of CFCs to 50% of the 1986 level by 1998 to ensure compliance with the Montreal Protocol.

## (4) The Minister may

- (a) increase the manufacture reference weighted aggregate quantity for the manufacture of chlorofluorocarbon by a person described in subsection (1), during a control period by an amount specified in subsection (5), or
- (b) assign to any other person a manufacture reference weighted aggregate quantity for the manufacture of chlorofluorocarbon during a control period in an amount specified in subsection (5),

where

- (c) a person described in subsection (1) has agreed in writing to have his manufacture reference weighted aggregate quantity for the manufacture of chlorofluorocarbon reduced for that control period,
- (d) the chlorofluorocarbon will be exported in that control period to a country operating under Article 5 of the Protocol, or
- (e) the government of another Party to the Protocol has agreed with the government of Canada to transfer all or a portion of its calculated level of production of chlorofluorocarbon to Canada, for the purpose of industrial rationalization.
- (5) For the purpose of subsection (4), the amount specified is an amount that does not exceed
  - (a) where paragraph (4)(c) applies, the amount by which the person referred to in that paragraph agreed to have his manufacture reference weighted aggregate quantity reduced;
  - (b) where paragraph (4)(d) applies, the weighted aggregate quantity of chlorofluorocarbon that will be exported; and
  - (c) where paragraph (4)(e) applies, the amount of the calculated level of production that the Party referred to in that paragraph has agreed to transfer to Canada.
