SPACE RESERVED IN PLACE DE VILLE

Question No. 742—Mr. McCutcheon:

1. (a) How much space has the government leased in the newly constructed Place de Ville (b) for what total annual rent (c) at what rate per square foot (d) for what purpose will the space be used (e) when was the lease negotiated?

2. If no lease was signed, what undertaking has the Department of Public Works given to the owner?

Hon. G. J. McIlraith (Minister of Public Works): 1. (a) In Tower "A", 215,163 square feet of office space. In Tower "B", 291,330 square feet of office accommodation and 4,858 square feet of storage space. (b) In Tower "A", the annual rental is \$1,037,085.66, for office space. In Tower "B", the annual rental is \$1,404,000 for office accommodation and \$9,716 for storage space. (c) The rate per square foot is \$4.82 per annum for office accommodation and \$2.00 per square foot per annum for storage space. (d) The space will be used to house the following departments and agencies: In Tower "A": Office accommodation, The Public Service Commission. In Tower "B": Office accommodation, The National Energy Board; The St. Lawrence Seaway Authority; The Department of Trade and Commerce; The Department of Industry; Canadian Government Committee on Corrections. Storage space: Sergeant-At-Arms of House of Commons; Department of Industry; National Energy Board; Department of Trade and Commerce. (e) The lease for Tower "A" was negotiated in July, 1967, and for Tower "B", in January, 1967.

2. In neither case has a lease been executed but, in both cases, the Department of Public Works has advised the owner of the approval of Treasury Board to enter into a lease.
