

Four large class rooms would take care of our immediate needs, although six are advisable. Grades VIII and IX need to be split, The present class of approximately 45 is too large for one teacher to handle, and the work there is so important as a preparation for Grades X and XI that there should be two teachers to look after it. A new high school teacher is needed urgently.

From now on. Physics and Chemistry will be necessary in Grades X and XI. After 1928, Physical Geography will not be accepted by McGill University as a matriculation subject. It will be necessary to provide for the teaching of Physics this year.

Advanced Mathematics ought to be taught when desired. It is necessary for Science Matriculation, and many of our pupils go to other schools because it is not taught here.

In conclusion, I give figures taken from the official records at Quebec to show the present size of our school. There are 51 High Schools in this province. Outside of Westmount (1) and of Montreal which has 5, there are 45. Of these schools Macdonald is fifth in size.

It will be noticed that these are all suburban high schools, If Macdonald is classed as a country high school, it is the largest of its class in the province.
