JOHN SAYRE, Philip J. Livingston, and Nathaniel Chandler, left Sandy-Hook on Friday the 8th day of August, and arrived at Annapolis the 17th.—They forwarded, by the Grand Duchess of Russia, Captain Holman, a letter to Thomas Knox and William Taylor, Esqrs. Committee of Correspondence at New-York, which was in the words following:

GENTLEMEN, Annapolis, August 19, 1783. W7E have the pleafure to inform you, that we arrived here on

Sunday laft, after a paffage of ten days, having left Sandy-Hook the 8th inftant, and that we fhall proceed to-morrow on our way to Halifax. As Mr. Sayre is going to St. John's, and does not expect to return to this place on public bufinefs within a fortnight, and as we entertain no hopes of feeing Mr. Stewart at Halifax within the above time, we have thought it advifeable for our mutual intereft, agreeable to the powers of fubfitution delegated to us, to folicit the Honourable Stephen Skinner, Efquire, to be a joint Agent with us in the important truft committed to our care, which he has been pleafed to accept of until his return to New-York. We have done this from a conviction that the meafure will be perfectly agreeable to the Affociation, and that no delays but fuch as are unavoidable fhould be fuffered in the profecution of an enquiry which, we hope, will prove of great benefit to us all.
