NEARLY BILLION BUSHELS AMERICAN WHEAT CROP

Official Forecast at Washington Shows Larger Yield Than Year Ago.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7.—The department of agriculture's production forecast of the country's principal farm crops, estimated from their condition August 1, and announced today are:

Winter wheat 675,000,000, compared with 523,000,000 in 1913.
Spring wheat 236,000,000, compared with 240,000,000 last year.
Corn 2,634,000,000, compared with 2,447,000,000 in 1913.
Oats 1,153,000,000, compared with 1,122,000,000 last year.
Barley 203,000,000, compared with 178,000,000 in 1913.
Rye 42,000,000, compared with 41,000,000 in 1913.
Buckwheat 17,000,000, compared with 14,000,000 last year.

Cornwall Board Asks Government Guarantee for Ocean Transportation.

CORNWALL, Aug. 7.—On the Cornwall cheese board today 1750 colored cheese was offered for sale. None of it was disposed of, however, owing to the fact that the buyers were instructed not to make purchases. Edropan were conditions and the inability of the wholesalers to ship to the old country were responsible for the quietness in the market. The board passed a resolution asking the Dominion department of agriculture to protect the Montreal produce merchants' association in a manner similar to that afforded the grain shippers by guaranteeing from loss or recompense in case of seizure while crossing the ocean. Last year at this date 1900 colored cheese sold at 12 7-8 cents.
