APPEALS FOR CIDER CAN BE MADE PROFITABLE French Investigator Gives Some Valuable Pointers to the Ontario Fruit Growers' Association.

That Canadian fruit growers could make good money by using their cull apples for cider, instead of feeding them to stock, was the advice given to the Ontario Fruit Growers' Convention last night by Louis Memmer of Paris, France, who is conducting experiments on the cider-making qualities of local fruit in Toronto University. He has found that 10 pounds of culls will make one gallon of cider; it costs 8 or 9 cents a gallon and can be sold locally at 15 cents. If the quality were good it would sell for 35 cents in Europe. A barrel of culls should easily net the grower \$1.35.
