THE TORONTO ATHLETES CLEAN UP AT HAMILTON

Win Ten of Open Events at Bobb
Kerr's Meet—Tait and Kiviat
Ran Dead Heat.

HAMILTON, April 30.—(Special).—The indoor championships held in the new armories last night, under the auspices of the Hamilton Rowing Club, and the 12th and 91st Regiments, provided some very interesting events. The affair was under the management of Bobby Kerr. There were 170 entries for the 15 events which were put on. Fifty-one of the entries were from Toronto.

The Queen City boys carried off honors out of all proportion to their entries, winning ten of the fourteen events open to them. The principal event of the evening was the special international, which was practically a race between Kiyat and Tait. E. Barclay (Hamilton Y.M.C.A.) being the only other entry.

Both runners set a heartbreaking pace from the gun to the tape, and both distinguished themselves for unfair tactics. As one was as much to blame as the other, however, their actions were overlooked, and the referee's decision was a

lead heat. The time of the race—2:19.70—was a Canadian record. The first two places were broken in the first 100 yards open, which was run in 2:21.45.
