Declines in the general list, after some early firmness in rails, shippings and coppers, ranged from three to 15 points, only leading the collapse just as they had featured the advance of recent weeks.

The bulk of the selling, much of which was clearly of an enforced character, with a liberal sprinkling of bearish pressure, centred around U. S. Steel, that stock furnishing about 25 per cent of the total turnover at a gross reaction of six points to 102, closing practically at the bottom.

Mexican Petroleum, which is in disfavor with the authorities of the exchange because of its spectacular performances, opened at a decline of 9-12 points, rallied six and in the broader selling of the last hour reacted 14 points, showing a loss of 31 points in two days.

Support Lacking.
Even the high-grade rails and shippings, metals and representative specialties broke sharply with speculative issues in the final hour, when support seemed almost wholly lacking, weakness prevailing at the end. Sales amounted to 95,000 shares.

Greater firmness of rails on Paris was the only reflection of the more favorable developments in the foreign situation, neutral remittances remaining unaltered.
