DISGUSTING CONDITIONS IN ENGLISH WORKSHOPS

Jam Factories, Bakeries and Sausage Factories Do Business in Unsanitary Fashions.

London, July 10.—The annual report of the inspector of factories and workshops to-day shows that the conditions here are quite as revolting as anything alleged of the Chicago Meat Packing revelations.

Another factory inspector found jam pots being washed in liquid like black soap, which smelled abominably.

Inspectors of bakeries found that it was a frequent custom to let children in them after the close of work on Saturdays.

The sausage factories, says the report, "are small, dilapidated, badly lit and often infested by rats."
