Hamilton Happenings

POLICE AND FIREMEN KEPT BUSY ALL DAY

Barber Arrested on Charge of Using Knife—Many People Take Advantage of Holiday.

HAMILTON, May 24.—(Special.)—Over ten thousand persons were carried by the James-street incline to-day at the opening of the Mountain View Park. This was the largest crowd ever handled in one day by the road.

The morning Mr. McLeod, 20 North-west-avenue, started out for Woodstock with his family and \$17 in cash. He and his family arrived all right, but the cash was missing.

The police and the firemen both had a very busy day. The police took in the bodies of drunk and arrested several arrests on more serious charges.

Constable Lowry interrupted a night on James near Pictou-street, this evening about 6 o'clock. While he was chasing the disturbers, who were Toronto excursionists, he says Charles Fleck, Toronto, stepped in and stopped him.

He men escaped, but Fleck was arrested on the charge of interfering with the police.

Today County Constable Springstead went to serve a summons on John Downing of the same village. Downing said he would be soaked anyway, and with these few remarks, he started thrashing the constable, who came out of the fray with a broken nose and a very badly damaged face.

Detectives Blecky and Miller arrested William, commonly known as "Reddy," Stevenson, on the charge of assaulting Tom Cornwall a few days ago in Weaver's Hotel.

Samuel Say, Dundas-road, got into the lutches of the police on the charge of stealing a bottle of whiskey from W. Carroll.

The firemen had to squelch three blazes started by youths and firecrackers. The first broke out amongst the facing stones laid down at the terminal station. The excelsior around the stones caught fire, and the stones were so badly smoked up that they will have to be re-cut at a cost of several hundred dollars.

A lot of excursionists accompanied the 15th Regiment to Buffalo and the 91st Highlanders to Woodstock.

The 18th Regiment stayed in town long enough to take part in the school children's exercises, headed by the regiment and the dignitaries of the board of education, the youths of the schools marched with flags from the Gore Park to Victoria-avenue, where the same combination had started a blaze on the roof.
