The Hospital for Sick Children.

The twenty-second annual report of the trustees of this hospital shows a successful year in the work of alding ailing little thildren. Out of 562 patients, 476 were discharged, 312 of whom were cured, 109 improved, 30 unimproved, and there were 25 deaths. The average stay of children was 56 days, and the cost per head per day was 85 cents. There were 444 children from Toronto and 118 from as many places in Ontarlo; 14 out of the 25 youngsters who died were in the hospital less than seven days, having-been brought in practically when all hope of recovery was gone. In a list of children's hospitals shows a less cost per capita than any out of a list of 41. This is an excellent showing for the management. The subscribers for over \$100 during the year were: Messrs H H Fudger, R Philp, Sir Donald Smith, John Kay, Son & Co, William Christle, W D Matthews, James Carruthers and William McCabe, and Miss A Cobourg.
