Last year there was but a single beet sugar factory in Michigan. This year nine factories are working up the crop of beets grown in that state. The actual output of the Illinois and Michigan factories this year is 34,000 tons, or 230,-000 barrels. That there will be accessions to the list of beet sugar factories next year is assured from the fact that a very conservative estimate of the profits from a factory of 500 tons daily capacity of beets is \$125,000 a year, exclusive of any bounty that the individual states may pay. As such a factory can be put up for \$250,000, it can be seen that it will pay for itself It has been proved beyond doubt that the climate and soil of the United States

is adapted to the culture of the sugar 20.00 the United States can produce more beets 12.00 to the acre on the average rich prairie land of the agricultural states than can be produced on the best beet-producing lands of Germany. As to the quality, there is no better test than that the first experirom the plant at Bay City brought within 1/2 cent of the regular market for the best granulated, and that all of it started in this season at only 1-16 cent a pound discount, and is now being sold at the

same price.

All the arguments in favor of the expansion of the beet sugar industry in the United States are arguments in favor of The soil of Ontario is just as well adapted to the cultivation of beets as is adapted to the cumulation of beers as is that of the adjoining state of Michigan. If factories will pay \$125,000 a year in Michigan, there is no reason why they should not pay equally well in this province. And the beet sugar industry is not the only one that could be set going in Canada, if the Government only had half the faith in this country that the United States or Germany have in theirs.
