

CROW'S NEST HELD AT 2.50

With Over 239 Bid—Advances in High-Priced Mining Stocks Last Week Numerous.

ROSSLAND MINES PROGRESS.

As shown in to-day's financial columns, good advances are being made by Crow's Nest Coal, Republic, Payne and Virtue. Crow's Nest on Saturday was bid up to 2.50, with 250 asked.

Mikado Output. Returns of the Mikado mine have been received at the Bureau of Mines. From Sept. 4 to Oct. 9, the mine was shut down for repairs.

In the clean up for the 20 days of September 405 tons of ore were crushed, and 118 ounces of gold taken. By the granite process, for the 30 days following, 521 long tons were treated, and 210 ounces of bullion secured.

This is below the average, and the decrease is caused by low-grade ore being treated. The Rossland Miner in its weekly review Dec. 17 says: The general manager, Mr. W. E. Payne, who is daily expected, has not yet arrived. Nothing has been done with the head works of the gravity tramway.
