Civil Assistants.

The jury found that the company was negligent in not having the main lead deep enough or providing sufficient support or foundation for the pipe; also that the company might have prevented the accident. The plaintiff, Mrs. Langstaff, was awarded \$200 damages, and her daughter \$200, with full costs of the suit. The suit of Rathbun v. Willis will be tried today.
