

DE WINDT'S WANDERINGS. Heard From While in Far East Si-

London, March 24.—Letters received nere from Harry De Windt, leader of the expedition which is attempting to make its way overland from Paris to New York, and which left the former city Dec. 19, 1901, dated Yakutsk, Siberia, Feb. 16, announced his intention to depart on the following day for Sredne-Kolymsk (in East Siberia, 1660 miles northeast of Yakutsk). De Windt had then already covered 2000 miles of his land journey since he left the railread, thru blinding blizzards and with the thermometer at from 25 to 50 degrees below zero. The officials at Yakutsk strongly urged Mr. De Windt not to continue his journey. They said the conditions were worse this year than ever, that the cold was more intense and that epidemics and famine were raging. The traveler, however, determined to proceed. 
