

A very informal meeting of the City Council and the Board of Health was held last night to confer with Engineers Chipman and Rust, of Toronto, on the sewerage system. The enginprincipal differences, which concerne -Mr. John H. Ginge, general man- the sizes of the main and trunk sewers.

The Board of Health had also a report, which favored the larger sizes proposed by Mr. Rust, on the ground that it was wise to provide for a greater population in future than was at first estimated. The cost of the various sewers was given as follows: Trunk sewer-36-inch brick and 30-inch steel
