SKATING CHAMPIONSHIPS

Toronto Mentioned at Annual Meeting of Skating Association.

MONTREAL, Nov. 11.—No decision was reached at the annual meeting of the Amateur Skating Association of Canada, held last night as to whether a championship race meet should be held here the coming winter. The decision was left in the hands of the honorary president. The following officers were elected for the year:

Whether a championship meet for Canada will be held here as last winter will depend upon later developments and the international meeting in Chicago. There is some talk of the meeting going to Toronto, but so far there is nothing definite.

After referring to the championships in London, the meeting was adjourned. "A meeting has been called in Toronto to form the Ontario Skating Association and when formed this body will apply for affiliation and will guard the interests of skating in that province."

9. H. A. AMENDMENTS
 Proposed to Reduce Age Limit of Juniors to Nineteen Years.

Copies of the proposed amendments to be considered at the O.H.A. annual convention, at the Temple Building, Toronto, a week from next Saturday, were sent out to the clubs to-day.

The only amendments that suggest any radical changes are in connection with the junior series. N. R. White of Grimsby, president of the O.H.A., is the author of the amendments.

Another amendment in regard to the juniors comes from James Sutherland of Kingston, who suggests that all games in this series be decided into quarters, with a fifteen-minute interval at the end of each 15 minutes of play, instead of one 10-minute intermission at half-time.
