ONTARIO ARCHITECTS

Past Year Most Successful in History of Association. The 22nd annual convention of the Ontario Association of Architects opened yesterday afternoon in the association rooms, 26 Western King-street, under the presidency of Mr. G. W. Gounlock.

Mr. Gounlock pointed out that the past year had been the most successful in the history of the architects of Ontario. In this regard some interesting figures were quoted.

Toronto shows an increase in building operations of 54 per cent over the previous year; Hamilton 18 per cent; Ottawa 162 per cent; Port William 90 per cent; and Berlin 129 per cent.

Mr. Gounlock thought that the Ontario Government should be urged to assist in establishing a certain standard for students entering into architecture as a profession.

A special paper was read by Ivan S. Macdonald on the subject of "Architectural Profession from the Outside."
