From the Rev. J. R. Campbell.

YARMOUTH, March 31, 1875.

I have much pleasure in saying that the Secretary and Treasurer of this branch of the D. C. S. will, by this mail, transmit a subscription list of upwards of \$270, our offering to the general funds of the Society, for 1875; an amount in excess of that of 1874, as that was in excess of the year before. It is especially gratifying to be able to make this report in the face of the fact that money has not been known to be so scarce for many years. But we think we see in this parish a slow yet steady growth in this grace of giving which will surely bring other graces in its wake.

I have thought it worth while, as the merchants do, to take stock, as I may say of our subseribers in a way that, due allowance being made for the continual variation that is going on in every parish, probably suggests more than it proves. I observe that the

whereby it appears that the new and increased subscriptions are in a healthy excess of the subscriptions decreased and subscribers removed.
